



## FELTON ROAD

COUNTRY OF ORIGIN: NEW ZEALAND OWNER: NIGEL GREENING

Eighteen years after being bought by Englishman Nigel Greening, Felton Road has gate-crashed the top 10 in the Most Admired list after debuting at number 13 last year, putting it hot on the heels of Villa Maria for the honour of highest-ranking Kiwi producer. Winemaker Blair Walter juggles his main role with those of general manager, chief of exports and global sales director, though pressure to force sales graphs in an upwards direction is non-existent. Felton Road has a zero-growth policy for environmental reasons and the prestigious Central Otago Pinot Noir for which it is best known – along with its Chardonnay and Riesling whites – is sold principally on allocation. with loval trade customers first in line. "Markets don't have the opportunity for growth unless it is because of a market that is in decline," says Greening, who adds that his mission is "to master what we already do rather than explore new ideas". He says: "While we have historically seen a steady migration of volume from the US – where restrictive market practices cause both pricing and placement issues – towards Asia, this has now largely stopped." Greening's business ethics mean he resists artificially ramping up prices as the Felton Road reputation grows, unless such moves are dictated by exchange rates and production costs. "Customer loyalty is a continued consideration," he says, "and we reward our customers by not greedily putting the prices up." Greening believes some of the love among our academy voters for the brand comes from his and Walter's willingness to travel the world sharing the Felton Road philosophy and its wines.
